Scholarship Eligibility and Rules:

- Contest is open to all High School Seniors, **Class of 2020**, who currently qualify for the government sponsored free and reduced lunch program.
- To apply, students must live in San Diego County and be enrolled in high school.
- Students must be planning to attend college and must provide, upon request, an acceptance letter from the college they are planning to attend in the fall.
- Contestants are encouraged to discuss their essay with teachers, parents or other friends but must write the essay by themselves, in his or her own words.
- Essays must be 500 words or less. If submitted the optional essay must be 200 words or less.
- All essays must be in digital form (Microsoft Word or Google Docs preferred). *No PDF's, scanned or mailed essays will be accepted.* Essays, along with a scanned copy of the application and any additional supporting material, should be sent via email only to info@abridgeforkids.org. **The student should put his/her full name and current high school in the Subject line of the email (ex. Tim Jones- San Diego High School).**
- Applications will be judged by a panel and winners will be chosen based on the following criteria:
 - Adherence to application requirements.
 - Strength of evidence demonstrating participation in and achievements obtained in academic, athletic, and/or artistic programs.
 - Essay content and clarity
- All applications must be submitted by midnight on May 1st, 2020.
- All winners will be contacted during the week of May 13th, 2020.
- Winners parent/ guardian must sign a photo release form prior to receiving their sponsorship.
- Up to \$5,000 in sponsorships will be given out to the winner(s) of the scholarship. Winners will be listed on our website no later than the week of May 20th, 2020.
